Pollinator Habitat Program

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The Seed A Legacy program establishes pollinator habitat projects following our NextGen Habitat Project design. Each project has two separate plantings – one for monarch butterflies and one for honey bees – and are documented to provide increased pollinator benefits over other pollinator conservation programs.

The objectives of the SEED A LEGACY program are to:

- Establish high-quality pollinator habitat using innovation and new technology.
- To work to establish the habitat in the regions of the country that are the most critical to pollinator health and habitat.
- Demonstrate how high-quality habitat can be designed and established in a manner that is more cost-effective, establishes quickly and provides superior weed control aspects.
- Designing pollinator habitat projects that will work in a wide range of situations and require less intense management activities in the future.
- Demonstrate how pollinator habitat can provide benefits for a wide range of important considerations like water quality, soil health, grassland songbirds, honey production, etc.
- To work with land managers using tools and options that work with agriculture to provide clear benefits for both the farm and pollinator habitat.

Towards that end, it's also important to note that the primary objectives of the SEED A LEGACY program are not focused around some the worth-while objectives of other conservation programs like:

- The establishment of pollinator habitat following native prairie restoration considerations.
- Designing, establishing and managing pollinator habitat using outdated tools or methods.
